__29. President Obama and Congress reached an agreement just before the August $2^{\text {nd }}$ deadline to increase the national debt ceiling allowing the Federal government to pay its creditors. The agreement includes a provision to reduce the national deficit by $\$ 2.7$ trillion over 10 years, which is the amount the debt ceiling could be raised. A little over $\$ 1$ trillion dollars is already part of that agreement, and a bi-partisan 12 member committee made up of 6 Democrats and 6 Republicans are supposed to propose another $\$ 1.5$ trillion in cuts or increased revenue to further reduce the national debt. If that committee can agree to a plan, it must then be approved by President Obama and both Houses of Congress. If they do not approve of the committee plan, deep cuts will automatically be made in Military spending and Medicare. The fact that military spending would be cut deeply is thought to be an incentive for Republicans to reach agreement, just as deep cuts in Medicare is supposed to serve as an incentive for Democrats to reach agreement. Based on this description and what you may know about the agreement reached between President Obama and both houses of Congress, do you favor or oppose that agreement?
