In June of last year, the United States Supreme Court ruled that former, and now current, President Trump is immune from criminal liability for any official acts taken while in office, and is absolutely immune for some core activities, including his alleged attempts to use the Justice Department to obstruct the results of the 2020 election, which means that presidents are essentially free to use their official powers to engage in criminal acts while being substantially free of accountability.
