Supporters of the proposed change in the law say that the change in the law is needed because Michigan is only one of two states that require individual item pricing. Shoppers will be able to check prices by using portable scanners and comparing printouts with the shelf price. Eliminating the requirement for individual item price tags would dramatically increase the productivity of stores, be a huge time saver, and also save stores a lot of money. Instead of putting individual price tags on every item of merchandise, stores would only have to replace the product. By providing portable scanners, shoppers who want to verify the accuracy of prices, can do so.

Opponents of the proposed change in the law say that the current law has served the state well. Consumers know what the price of an item is because the law requires individual item prices. They have come to expect it. If there are no prices on each item, shoppers will have to jump through too many hoops to even discover overcharging errors, let alone be able to collect for the amount of the overcharge, or the penalty up to 5 dollars. Shoppers should be able to easily discover pricing errors. That's why it doesn't make sense to eliminate the item pricing law.
