INTRO TO Q. 20:

Project 2025 is the product of a coalition of members of the Heritage Foundation, a conservative think tank. The authors of Project 2025 include many senior White House and cabinet officials from the former Trump administration – including his Director of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management – and is billed as a plan for a future Republican president's administration. The centerpiece of the nearly 1,000 page document is to greatly expand the control a President has over the day-to-day operations of federal agencies by giving authority to the President to fire as many as 50,000 current civil service employees and replace them with appointees who are loyal to the administration's agenda. Once the President's control over departments is established through political appointments at department and agency supervisory levels, the aims of Project 2025 can be more easily achieved. Some of the goals of this plan include:

- Reducing taxes on corporations.
- The elimination of the Affordable Care Act.
- Direct White House control over enforcement and prosecution decisions made by lawyers in the Department of Justice and agents of the FBI.
- Renaming the Department of Health and Human Services to the Department of Life and create
 within it a Life Task Force, responsible for creating a national abortion database by requiring
 states to report the number of abortions performed in the state, at which stage of development the
 fetus was aborted, the reason for the abortion, the mother's state of residence, and the method
 used to perform the procedure.
- Eliminating the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration that provides weather, climate, and coastal science services including tracking hurricanes; and
- Requiring the Federal government to maintain a biblically based, social-science reinforced definition of marriage and family.
