## "Skunk works" technology based education proposal

This "Skunk Works" group included both state employees and executives from private corporations involved with selling Internet-related products and services. The group has been developing plans for an education system that would replace teachers with a technology based learning system, designed to save state tax dollars. Under the proposal, the goal would be to operate a "value school" for $\$ 5,000$ per student instead of the average of more than $\$ 7,000$ per student currently paid to local public schools to teach children, and have the per pupil funding follow the student, who would pay for their education choices by using a debit-card type of system.
