In looking at other demographic breakouts beside political party affiliation, Obama leads among all women by a 47 to 44 percent plurality, and also among all men by a 48 to 45 percent plurality. Obama leads among men age 50 and over by 50 to 41 percent, but trails Romney among men age 18 to 49 by a 48 to 44 percent plurality. Obama and Romney were tied among women age 18 to 49 at 46 percent, and Obama leads women age 50 and over by a 51 to 44 percent majority.

Romney leads among voters under age 50 by 47 to 45 percent, while Obama leads among voters age 50 and over by a 51 to 43 percent majority.

Obama leads in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties 50 to 43 percent, in Western Michigan by 49 to 42 percent, in the Outer Metro area by 48 to 40 percent, in Wayne County by 62 to 31 percent, and in the Bay area by 46 to 45 percent. Romney leads in Northern Michigan 54 to 44 percent, in Central Michigan 53 to 43 percent, in Macomb County 51 to 41 percent, and in Oakland County by 55 to 38 percent.

Obama and Romney are tied outside of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties.
Obama leads among voters who said their financial situation is "good" by 59 to 35 percent, while Romney leads among voters who said their financial situation is "bad" by 57 to 34 percent, as well as among those who said their finances are "in the middle" by a narrow 48 to 45 percent plurality.

Romney leads among the 66 percent who said Romney won the debate by 62 to 32 percent, while Obama leads Romney among voters who said Obama won the debate by 97 percent, with 75 to 10 percent of those saying they tied voting for Obama and by 63 to 23 percent of voters who were undecided about the debate also Obama.

Obama leads among pro-choice voters by 71 to 22 percent, while Romney leads among pro-life voters 73 to 20 percent.

Romney leads among voters with children 54 to 39 percent, while Obama leads among voters without children by 52 to 41 percent.

Obama leads among union members 64 to 34 percent and among households where someone else is a union member by 62 to 31 percent, while Romney leads among non-union households 49 to 42 percent.

Obama leads among voters age 18 to 34 by 50 to 41 percent, among voters age 50 to 64 by 51 to 42 percent, and among voters age 65 and over by 50 to 43 percent. Romney leads among voters age 35 to 49 by 52 to 41 percent.

Obama leads among voters with a high school or less education by 52 to 43 percent, among voters with a post high school technical education by 49 to 46 percent, and among college educated voters by a 46 to 45 percent edge.

Obama leads among Protestants 49 to 44 percent and among voters with other religious preferences or no preference 50 to 40 percent, while Obama leads among Catholics 54 to 43 percent.

Obama leads among African Americans 89 to 5 percent, among other races by 51 to 34 percent, while Romney leads among white voters 52 to 41 percent.

Obama leads among voters making under $\$ 50 \mathrm{~K}$ by 56 to 38 percent, and among voters making $\$ 50 \mathrm{~K}$ to $\$ 100 \mathrm{~K}$ by 51 to 42 percent, while Romney leads among voters making over $\$ 100 \mathrm{~K}$ by 53 to 44 percent.

When the presidential race is simulated by assigning undecided voters to each candidate based on their partison leanings, Obama leads Romney by a bare 50 to $\mathbf{4 6}$ percent majority.
